Today I am going to the Lincoln Children's Museum.

I will know I am there when I see the blue and red balls in front of the building!







When I get to the museum, I may need to wait in line. I will wait patiently for my turn.

When exploring the main floor, I will notice the Union Bank and Trust exhibit, a HyVee grocery store, a Runza restaurant, and more!





If I visit the Grow Zone area with a friend or family member who is under 3, I will need to take off my shoes and put them in a cubbie to keep the floor nice and clean in that area.



When I visit the lower level of the museum I will notice a very tall cuckoo clock I can crawl inside of and blue blocks I can build with.








I can dress up and put on a show at the Johnny Carson Theatre. In the backstage area, I will find many different costumes and buttons that make sound effects.





I will also notice an area that is blocked off to make way for a new exhibit that will be so much fun to discover once it's done.



I will also see another exhibit on the lower level called Exploring Trees -Inside and Out.

There will be many science and sensory activities. I can plant a tree, listen to and smell nature, look through a microscope, build a bird house, and even climb inside a tree.





On the upper level of the museum I can build with colorful blocks using buttons to control Riley the Robot's long, electric arms.





There is a photo booth exhibit where I can take my picture with **Husker-themed** scenes. My adult can email my picture to themselves so we can keep it to look at once we get home.





There are familiar exhibits to play in as well.

I can push the buttons and look for new additions in the model train area.

I can crawl and climb in the Prairie Dog Tunnels.







If I need a break from exhibit play, or just a quieter place to be, I can visit Tinker Theatre where a museum friend will help me create a special art project to take home.

Tinker Theatre has special hours though, so my adult can check the museum's website to plan our visit times if needed.





If I get hungry while we are at the museum I can visit Kazoo's U-STOP cafe to have a snack. I can have my snack inside at a table or outside on the patio.





Some places in the museum may be exciting and loud. I will need to remember to take turns with other visitors and try to stay calm.

If I am having a hard time, my adult can ask for a sensory bag at the Welcome Desk to make my visit more enjoyable.





When I am all done playing, it will be time to go.

If I followed the rules by taking turns, using hand sanitizer, using walking feet, and listening to my adult, I will be able to come back.
